Best in Show Syrian was a short haired golden belonging to Tristar and reserve Best in Show was another short haired golden belonging to Lilliput. Tristar did the double in dwarfs with a normal Campbell Best in Show and a normal Winter white Reserve.

Scott and family kept us all 'fed and watered' and Pete and Chris dealt with the sales and tombola accordingly.

As usual I would like to thank **everyone** who helped in any way – particularly those who set the hall up first thing in the morning and those who put things away in the afternoon and, of course, those who picked up a broom and swept the hall clean.

#### Judge's Report, Syrian Classes, Dawlish 8th March 2025

I think this is the first time I have ever judged at this show in all my now 50 years of Judging Syrian Hamsters. 66 hamsters greeted me on the show bench. Interesting mix of colours and patterns and coat types. Rexes seem to be gaining in popularity.

Thank you to Reece Minerve for book stewarding and Emily Whiteley for pen stewarding and to both of them for keeping me on the straight and narrow all day. Thank you also to Jean Tye for her sterling work as Show Secretary.

**Golden –** 2 beautiful large males came 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> in class and went on to take Best in Show for Tristar and Reserve Best in Show for Lilliput Hams. The first placed had beautiful type and big well held ears and a lovely rich glow to the coat. The 2<sup>nd</sup> placed was very close behind but lacked the richness of colour of the first placed.

**Cream –** Interesting mixture of too dark and too light coloration. Winner was a lovely female, nice broad type and head. Did have thin belly fur but so did most of the others in the class. 2<sup>nd</sup> placed had patchy ears but a lovely coat and decent wide type.

**AOC Male –** 1<sup>st</sup>. A lovely sable – very glossy coat, decent colour and big eyes and ears. Lacked size. 2<sup>nd</sup> – a melanistic yellow – best black top coat I've seen in a melanistic yellow in a while but a sprinkling of white hairs and undercoat lacking required richness dropped his colour points. Also dense short coat.

**AOC Female** – A sable female with a lovely glossy coat came first, however some white flecks in coat and paler undercolour lost it some marks overall but its excellent type gave it best in class. 2<sup>nd</sup> placed a nice neat dark grey – beautiful ticking, small and with a narrow head but carried its ears beautifully.

**Patterned –** Winner was a large sable banded male – best type in the class – lovely head, big ears. and dense fur. Band was narrower than ideal. 2<sup>nd</sup> placed by a whisker, a black tortoiseshell. Very good even distribution of black and yellow patches with minimal brindling and nice dense fur.

**Satin** – Only 2 in class. Winner a satin BE Cream, slightly better type than the golden satin who came second. Both were fairly small animals.

**Longhaired Cream –** Lovely big hamsters in this class with above average type marks. Winner excelled on density and softness of coat. 2<sup>nd</sup> placed again a nice coat. Both black eyed cream females. Several of the creams in this class in my opinion were too dark in colour, verging on copper.

**Longhaired AOC Male** – 1<sup>st</sup> placed a lovely big dusky yellow male who came 3<sup>rd</sup> overall in the show. Dense but not a long coat. 2<sup>nd</sup> placed a golden male. Lacked richness but a youngster, so may darken. Nicer length coat.

**Longhaired AOC Female** – 1<sup>st</sup> – a rich, nicely flashed cinnamon with good broad type and lovely wide well held ears. 2<sup>nd</sup> a large dark ticked golden. Lacked some richness but again good broad type.

**Longhaired Patterned** – 1<sup>st</sup> a banded cream. Lovely even band – best band I've seen for a while. 2<sup>nd</sup> a sable roan. More spotty than marbled and quite silvered.

**Longhaired Satin –** 1<sup>st</sup> a golden satin. Reasonable length fur and decent type. 2<sup>nd</sup> place a satin BEC again some long fur – lacked density.

**Rex** – 1<sup>st</sup> placed a lovely but small dove with a dense, very frizzy coat. Even dove grey with deep lilac tone. 2<sup>nd</sup> a cream shorthaired. Again narrow type and pale sheen to the coat but largest in the class. Common feature in this class was narrow type.

**Non-Standard** – Some interesting colours in here. A thought for the future would be for the Show Secretary to be allowed to write on the variety that the exhibitor thinks the colour is. Anyway 1<sup>st</sup> placed was a ?silver grey smoke pearl shorthaired. Reasonable allrounder. 2<sup>nd</sup> placed was a ?melanistic smoke pearl. Slightly better type than 1<sup>st</sup> placed but coat not as dense. There were also a blue and a champagne in the class.

My favourite hamster of the day didn't win any classes but was a really pretty dove dominant spotted tortoiseshell shorthaired. It's the one I would have liked to take home!

It was nice to see good examples of dark grey, cinnamon and dove even if they didn't necessarily win any of the classes and well done to people with golden shorthaired and longhaired creams – on average they did really well in the overall points in the show.
